**Asheboro** Boys & Girls Club served **195** children and teens.

**Our Members**

- 73% African American
- 10% Caucasian
- 2% Hispanic
- 14% Multi-Ethnic
- 1% Other
- 44% ages 6-9
- 38% ages 10-12
- 18% ages 13-18



- 55% Males
- 45% Females

- 74% Single Parent Homes

**47** Club members participated in **SMART Moves** substance abuse and pregnancy prevention program and **79% passed** the written post-test verifying their understanding of prevention behaviors.

**19 female** Club members participated in the **SMART Girls** teen pregnancy and substance abuse program with **100% passing** the written post-test verifying their understanding of prevention behaviors.

**Of the 31 Healthy Habits** Program participants, **96% passed** the post-test verifying their understanding of living a healthy lifestyle.

**109 members** participated in **98 fitness sessions**.

**27 members** participated in **Street Smart** gang prevention programming. **94%** passed the post-test verifying their understanding of gangs.

Club members planned and conducted **266 hours** of community service projects.

**9 Torch Club** members participated in **3** leadership development meetings for members ages 11-13.



Through tracking of report cards of Power Hour participants **91% maintained or improved to average to above average grades**.

Club staff worked in the schools providing **47** hours helping youth succeed.

Clubs provided **3 parent-teacher** activities that were attended by **180 participants**.

**2 "World of Work"** tours for **42** participants were held this year.
